WPPS BUILDING PROJECT

Thank you to those parents that joined us last Thursday evening (03 August 2023) for the Building Project evening presentation, a small although engaging session. As mentioned, the project had been broken into two Phases namely, Phase 1 (*the current Admin and Grade 1 Block*) and then, Phase 2 (*the current Grade 2 Block and First floor*) for which we are looking for assistance in raising between R3m (*for Phase 1, ideally by month end*) and R11m (*for both Phases*).

REBUILD OF GRADE R (EXISTING ADMINISTRATIVE BLOCK), 1 AND 2 BLOCKS

Greetings! We are excited to share some incredible news with you, marking a significant milestone in Winston Park Primary School's history. This achievement has been a long time coming, and we hope you share in our enthusiasm.

In our school's 48th anniversary year, we continue our commitment to providing an exceptional learning environment for your children. With this in mind, we have exciting plans underway to convert our prefabricated blocks into solid brick structures. These blocks were initially built as "temporary structures" 48 years ago and have served our school admirably throughout the years.

Since our last AGM

During our last AGM, we shared our vision to enhance the school's infrastructure. This included rebuilding the Grade 1 and 2 blocks with an additional floor for specialty classrooms. We have made significant progress in planning this and have decided to include the rebuild of the administrative block at the same time. This block will house the Grade R classrooms and provide them with direct access to the field near the Rose gate entrance. Next year, the Grade 1 classes will move to the current Grade R classrooms location. Then, we can begin rebuilding the Grade 1 and 2 blocks in the new year. The administrative block will move to the current Grade 1 classrooms location. It's a challenging project to coordinate, although an opportune time to combine all three initiatives.

Your dedicated MANCO, SGB, and Building Committee, led by architect Amanda Lead, from Lead architects, have meticulously designed the conversion plans. After multiple iterations, and input from teachers and various stakeholders, the SGB approved the plans on 22 June 2023. We are happy to announce that they have been submitted for approval to the eThekwini Municipality and Department of Education.

Please note that these plans extend beyond the current Grade R, 1, and 2 block rebuilds and are subject to future funding availability.

These plans will result in improved learning spaces for our children over the next planned year and a half.
